CTEL Course Sequence

EDEL/EDP/EDSE 439: SDAIE: Specially Designed Academic Instruction in English. This course covers methods of teaching content to English language learners; oral, reading, and writing strategies; and curriculum development with application to K-12 teaching.

LING 329: Introduction to Language Acquisition.

This course includes study of the acquisition of first and second languages, the factors considered essential in acquiring language, including cognitive and social factors, and the relationship of these factors to schooling.

EDEL 430: Social and Cultural Diversity in US Schools.

This course includes study of historical and structural factors that either empower or oppress people based on language, class, race/ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, ability, or religion. The course focuses on educational responses to diversity.

EDP 485. Theoretical Foundations of Language Minority Education.

This course focuses on the historical and political contexts of the development of educational language policies. Models of bilingual and English language development education, and assessment of English learners within these programs, are studied.
